

### A TOP-DOWN FAITH

The phrase "from the top down" is often used to denote a hierarchical system of management or governance. The will and beliefs and directives of those "at the top" are imposed—sometimes aggressively, sometimes even oppressively—on those below. From the top town. We have entered the second half of the Church Year, the half that focuses on the teachings of the Christian faith. We will see that Christianity is very much a top-down faith. Christian teachings come "from the top down," but not in the sense that those teachings are oppressively imposed on us. When we call Christianity a "top-down faith," we mean that it tells us things about God that are so beautiful and good—teachings that couldn't possibly have originated from human thinking. The Christian faith contains teachings that are so wonderful that we would never even believe them unless God himself revealed their truthfulness to us. So, God sent his Spirit from heaven to earth—from the top down—to empower his children to believe that which would otherwise be totally unbelievable

### THEME OF THE DAY: FROM THE TINIEST SEED GROWS THE LARGEST KINGDOM

Usually, a kingdom advances and is secured through things like military might or political force or worldly wealth. It can be tempting to believe the same holds true in the kingdom of God. Perhaps we think churches would flourish if we had the right rulers passing and enforcing the right laws. Or we believe that for a church to do good requires a robust budget. Political force. Worldly wealth. This way of thinking is breathtakingly wrong. We need God to give us the top-down faith that grasps the fact that kingdom of God advances in ways that are imperceptible. Through something that seems insignificant to most—the gospel—the King of kings establishes his reign in human hearts. Even Jesus himself taught that the gospel seems unimpressive, for he often compared the gospel to a tiny seed. Yet within a seed is hidden life. As the seed of the gospel is planted, the largest of all kingdoms grows.


#### **SECOND READING:** Colossians 1:3-8


GOSPEL READING: Mark 4:26-34 (Sermon Text <u>Underlined</u>)


(The kingdom grows when the seed is sown. The Word works.)

<sup>26</sup>He also said, "This is what the kingdom of God is like. A man scatters seed on the ground. <sup>27</sup>Night and day, whether he sleeps or gets up, the seed sprouts and grows, though he does not know how. <sup>28</sup>All by itself the soil produces grain—first the stalk, then the head, then the full kernel in the head. <sup>29</sup>As soon as the grain is ripe, he puts the sickle to it, because the harvest has come." <sup>30</sup>Again he said, "What shall we say the kingdom of God is like, or what parable shall we use to describe it? <sup>31</sup>It is like a mustard seed, which is the smallest of all seeds on earth. <sup>32</sup>Yet when planted, it grows and becomes the largest of all garden plants, with such big branches that the birds can perch in its shade." <sup>33</sup>With many similar parables Jesus spoke the word to them, as much as they could understand. <sup>34</sup>He did not say anything to them without using a parable. 



OUR KIDS GIVE TO MISSIONS 2023-2024 mission projects of our school and Sunday school children are complete! St. John's-Montello Little Lambs and the Montello & Princeton campuses of Christ Alone Christian Academy (CALA) worked together. A first semester gift of \$766.99 was collected for Kids C.A.R.E. Missionary Kids Retreats (to help kids raised on foreign mission fields to be reacclimated to life in the United States). St. John's-Montello Sunday School also adopted this Kids C.A.R.E. project and gave \$235.30. The total gift to the Kids C.A.R.E. project is \$1,002.29. It will be pooled with offerings of WELS kids throughout the U.S. and will be presented at the 61st LWMS Convention in Sioux Falls, SD, on June 27-30. Kids C.A.R.E. is a program of the Lutheran Women's Missionary Society (LWMS). LL & CALA gave a second semester gift of \$879.05 to the Winnebago Lutheran Academy (WLA) capital campaign (for the new campus construction). WLA is our area Lutheran high school, and Montello and Princeton are members of the WLA Association. Thank you to our kids for giving cheerfully, and thank you to parents for teaching mission giving by encouraging their children on these projects. To God be the glory!





Little Lambs Preschool Synod Consultation – Several months ago, a formal recommendation was presented to the Board of Education to place our 3K/4K Little Lambs (LL) Preschool under the administration of Christ Alone Lutheran Academy's (CALA) principal and school board. CALA is one school with two campuses (grades K-2, Montello; grades 3-8, Princeton) and is administered and financially supported by both St. John's, Montello and St. John's, Princeton. LL Preschool is supported and administered solely by St. John's, Montello. Consideration of this recommendation by our ministry teams resulted in more questions than answers. Therefore, the Synod's lead Early Childhood Ministry consultant, Ann Potter, was hired to assess our situation and provide recommendations for the best path forward to administer LL and accommodate future growth. Ann was here for a site visit May 9-10. She visited both campuses, spent time speaking with 18 people from our LL and CALA ministry teams, and then presented her recommendations orally to a large gathering of those with whom she had spoken. She recently followed up with a very detailed written report which will serve as a guiding document for our ministry teams to strengthen our LL program. Some key recommendations from this consultation follow.

- (1) Continue to operate LL Preschool under St. John's, Montello. There is no reason to place LL under CALA.
- (2) Pursue state licensing of LL Preschool and Eagles Nest wraparound care under St. John's, Montello. This would open the door to state financial assistance for low-income families who need childcare in order to maintain their jobs. Our building is deemed suitable for state licensure, but a fenced play area would be needed outside. State licensure would open the door to expanding outreach ministry opportunities.
- (3) Encourage area congregations to start their own preschool program. St. John's, Princeton, has already expressed interest. These area preschools could then feed students into CALA.

The hope is that this consultation exercise will help bolster our LL program, grow opportunities to share the Gospel with young souls and their families, assimilate lost souls into the family of believers, and nurture young souls with God's Word and the love of Jesus well into the future. Please keep our LL and CALA ministries in your prayers. – St. John's Board of Education
